

MEALS AT OUR TABLE

FEEDING KIDS

21%	of those we serve are kids
663	kids served annually through the Backpack Program
19	partner school sites
2,473	backpacks distributed per month during the school year
35,828	snacks were served each month, on average

FEEDING SENIORS

43%	of those we serve are seniors
76,599	pounds distributed at Rose Park Senior Food Pantry
930	senior backpacks distributed in Callahan County

FEEDING COMMUNITIES

4.5 MIL	pounds of food distributed
1 MIL+	pounds of fresh produce and dairy products distributed
6,664	families served per month, on average
77,537	meals served, on average, per month through meal sites


